GOVERNMENT FEES AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 2000

The Minister of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2(1) of the Government Fees Act 1965 and every other power vested in him, makes the following Regulations:

Citation

1 These Regulations may be cited as the Government Fees Amendment Regulations 2000.

Revocation and replacement of Schedule to S.R.&O. 24/1976

The Schedule to the Government Fees Regulations 1976 is revoked and the Schedule set out in the Schedule to these Regulations is substituted.

Commencement and transitional

- 3 (1) Subject to paragraph (2), these Regulations commence on 1 April 2000 ("commencement day").
