#### **GOVERNMENT FEES AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 2006**

The Minister of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2(1) of the Government Fees Act 1965, makes the following Regulations:

#### Citation

1 These Regulations may be cited as the Government Fees Amendment Regulations 2006.

#### Substitution of Schedule

2 The Schedule to the Government Fees Regulations 1976 is revoked and the Schedule to these Regulations is substituted.

#### Commencement and transitional

- 3 (1) Subject to paragraph (2), these Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 2006.
- (2) Nothing in these Regulations shall affect the validity of a fee, paid before the coming into force of these Regulations.

"accessory structures" include, but are not limited to, tennis courts, parking areas, driveways, docks, walls, satellite dish receivers, signs, piers, platforms, patios and like structures which do not result in the creation of additional, enclosed floor space, that are incidental to the principal building and located on the same lot; and, for the avoidance of doubt, a swimming pool is not an accessory structure and any separate application for a pool shall be subject to the minimum fee set out in either paragraph (1)(a)(i) or (2)(a)(i), whichever is applicable;
