GOVERNMENT FEES AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 2012

BR 19 / 2012

The Minister of Finance, in exercise of the power conferred by section 2 of the Government Fees Act 1965, makes the following Regulations:

Citation

1 These Regulations may be cited as the Government Fees Amendment Regulations 2012.

Revokes and replaces Schedule

2 The Schedule to the Government Fees Regulations 1976 is revoked and replaced with the Schedule to these Regulations.

Transitional

3 Nothing in these Regulations affects the validity of a fee that is paid before the coming into operation of these Regulations.

Commencement

4 Subject to regulation 3, these Regulations come into operation 1 April 2012.
