STATISTICS (CENSUS OF POPULATION AND HOUSING) ORDER 2016

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The Minister responsible for statistics, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 5(3) of the Statistics Act 2002, makes the following Order—

## STATISTICS (CENSUS OF POPULATION AND HOUSING) ORDER 2016

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### Citation

1 This Order may be cited as the Statistics (Census of Population and Housing) Order 2016.

### Interpretation

2 In this Order—

“Bermudian” means a person who has Bermudian status under the Bermuda Immigration and Protection Act 1956;

“census day” has the meaning given in paragraph 3;

“census night” means the period of time on census day beginning at sunset and ending at 11:59 p.m.;

“census officer” means a person authorized by the Director to assist the Director in the performance of his functions under the Act;

“census period” means the period beginning on Saturday 21 May 2016 and ending on Saturday 31 December 2016;

“government ship” means any warship or any ship for the time being used by the government of any State for other than commercial purposes;

“group dwelling unit” means a building where people live collectively for commercial or communal purposes and the cooking, sleeping, and sanitary facilities are shared, and includes staff quarters, a rooming house, and a hotel used as a place of usual residence;

“hotel” means any guest house, boarding house or lodging house;

“household” means a person or a group of persons who usually reside at the same private dwelling unit, group dwelling unit, non-sheltered location, or institution;

“household member” means a person who is a resident of Bermuda, and includes a person studying abroad;

“household reference person” means a household member who is responsible, or mainly responsible, for running the affairs of the household;

“institution” means a place where a person’s freedom of movement is restricted to some degree, and includes a hospital, nursing home, residential care home, children’s home, correctional facility or other place of detention;

“non-sheltered location” means any location used by a person or a group of persons having no fixed abode;

“private dwelling unit” means a separate, self-contained unit consisting of one or more rooms and having its own cooking, living and sanitary facilities, and includes a vessel which is ordinarily moored or anchored in Bermuda;

“reference week” means Friday 13 May 2016 to Thursday 19 May 2016;

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“resident of Bermuda” means a person who—

- (a) lived in Bermuda for six months or more immediately before census day;
- (b) intends to live in Bermuda for six months or more immediately after census day;

“usually resides” means the place where a person lives and sleeps the majority of the time, and to which he intends to return when he is away;

“vessel” means any boat or ship not ordinarily moored or anchored in Bermuda.

Census day

3 Census day is Friday 20 May 2016.

Director to take a census

4 The Director shall take a census of population and housing of Bermuda during the census period.

Matters respecting persons at a private dwelling unit

5 (1) A household reference person living at a private dwelling unit shall, during the census period, give information to a census officer in respect of the matters set out in Part A of Schedule 1 as they relate to the household reference person and any other household member, and in Part B of Schedule 1 as they relate to the household and the private dwelling unit, as such matters stood on census day.

(2) Notwithstanding subparagraph (1), any other household member who has attained the age of sixteen years shall, as far as possible, give information to a census officer in respect of the matters set out in Part A of Schedule 1 as they relate to that household member and any other household member.

Matters respecting persons at a group dwelling unit

6 (1) A household reference person living at a group dwelling unit shall, during the census period, give information to a census officer in respect of the matters set out in Part A of Schedule 2 as they relate to the household reference person and any other household member, and in Part B of Schedule 2 as they relate to the household and the group dwelling unit, as such matters stood on census day.

(2) Notwithstanding subparagraph (1), any other household member who has attained the age of sixteen years shall, as far as possible, give information to a census officer in respect of the matters set out in Part A of Schedule 2 as they relate to that household member and any other household member.

Matters respecting persons at a hotel

7 (1) A person in charge of a hotel shall, during the census period, give to a census officer the names of persons who stayed temporarily at the hotel on census night.

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(2) The person in charge of a hotel shall, during the census period, give to a census officer the full names and room numbers of persons who, as of census night, usually reside at the hotel.

(3) A household reference person who usually resides at a hotel shall, during the census period, give information to a census officer in respect of the matters set out in Part A of Schedule 2 as they relate to the household reference person and any other household member, and in Part B of Schedule 2 as they relate to the household and the group dwelling unit, as such matters stood on census day.

(4) Notwithstanding subparagraph (3), any other household member who has attained the age of sixteen years shall, as far as possible, give information to a census officer in respect of the matters set out in Part A of Schedule 2, as they relate to that household member and any other household member.

(5) The person in charge of a hotel shall grant any reasonable request by the census officer for assistance in the execution of his duty under the Act in respect of persons who usually reside at the hotel.

### Matters respecting persons at a non-sheltered location

8 (1) A household reference person living at a non-sheltered location shall, during the census period, give information to a census officer in respect of the matters set out in Part A of Schedule 3 as they relate to the household reference person and any other household member, and in Part B of Schedule 3 as they relate to the household, as such matters stood on census day.

(2) Notwithstanding subparagraph (1), any other household member who has attained the age of sixteen years shall, as far as possible, give information to a census officer in respect of the matters set out in Part A of Schedule 3, as they relate to that household member and any other household member.

### Matters respecting persons at an institution

9 A person in charge of an institution shall, during the census period, give to a census officer information in respect of the matters set out in Schedule 4 as they relate to persons who stayed at the institution on census night.

### Matters respecting commanding officer or captain

10 The commanding officer, captain, or other person in charge of persons on board a government ship, or a vessel, shall during the census period give to the Director a list of all such persons who were in Bermuda on census night.

### Manner of census taking

11 The Director may require persons referred to in paragraphs 5 to 10 to furnish such information by electronic means, telephone interview, personal interview, or mail.
